Plants for Dry Shade

Lack of sunlight, tree roots, lack of nutrients, and competition for moisture make dry shade locations difficult to plant. To increase moisture retention, amend the soil with organic matter and mulch 2-4 inches deep.

Below is a list of plants that do well in dry shade conditions.
